Stoneleigh Community Orchard

Stoneleigh Orchard CIC - Motslow Hill plantation update - Tom Marshall

There is a saying that you start to understand the meaning of life when you plant trees in whose shade you will never sit.

It is now five years since The Woodland Trust planted a thousand native trees on Motslow Hill. I remember it was a cold winter and the planting was delayed for a couple of months. To be sure it was the right location, they sent an expert to view the site before agreeing to tree planting. The trees would extend the existing woods on the steep slope by the river and alongside Stoneleigh Road. That was good. The site was over a hectare, also good. The existing field was just pasture and not already an important habitat like a wildflower meadow or a wetland. So woodlands would increase biodiversity. Also good. They planted a mixture of trees, oaks, birches, hawthorns, elders, hazel, crab apples, rowans, bird cherries, spindles and others. There were even a few pines. But they planted no ash trees. Ash dieback (Hymenoscyphus fraxineus) was already widespread in 2018 and tree nurseries would not move ash trees for fear of spreading it. In the first two years after planting they came back to spray weed killer around the base of the trees. This is to stop the young saplings having to compete with vigorous pasture grass for water and nutrients. A year after planting, they did a survey to see how many trees had died. In total about one in five. But this was apparently about usual. But it also meant there were some gaps in the woodland and some empty treetubes.

In a few places I have filled in gaps with some non-native trees. A friend's living Christmas tree filled one spot and is now growing well. I planted a few redwoods, unfortunately about half of these died, they weren't well enough established to cope with some of our recent hot

summers. But a few redwoods are still there and I have dreams that one day they will tower over Motslow Hill. I was given some North American oaks and these are also growing well, although they are still small. I also added to the native trees by transplanting large self-seeded hollies and hawthorns from my garden. I even planted some ash seedlings, I know most will succumb to ash dieback, but if only one or two survive it means there will be a few ash trees for the next generations to see.

As time has gone on, the planted trees are beginning to look like a woodland. There are now a few places where the trees are 15 or 20 feet high. This has brought both human and animal interest. A local beekeeper has some hives among the trees. There are tracks between the trees and the distinctive tiny hoofprints of muntjac deer. Although welcome in some ways, the deer also eat the smaller trees or nibble at the bark, causing some trees to die. But as the trees are getting bigger they also become more resilient.

There are still gaps where trees have died. So if anyone has a growing Christmas tree they are thinking of throwing away, perhaps get in touch. There may be a home for it on Motslow Hill!

HS2 UPDATE

Residents continue to be all too aware of disruptive activities in our area. Advanced warning of some road works and closures have been posted to some, but by no means all residents, which adds to the confusion. Where possible, notice will also be given in the News, village website and facebook page but the main responsibility for keeping the community informed remains with HS2 Ltd.

It has recently come to light that, despite assurances to the contrary from HS2 Ltd and the contractor, BBV, planning permission has yet to be obtained for access from the construction site to Stoneleigh Road and thence the A46. This is a very serious set back.

The next few weeks will see various traffic lights and road closures along the Ashow Road and Crewe Lane while site clearance, drainage and other preparation work is carried out. It is expected that Crewe Lane will close completely near its junction with the Ashow Road from 6-27 March. Sporadic traffic lights will continue on Dalehouse Lane and will be installed on Kenilworth Road near Gibbett Hill Road to allow plant crossing.

Meanwhile road closures etc. will continue in connection with the new A46 crossing. Drivers are advised to use extreme caution. Slip roads between Festival and Thickthorn Islands will be closed from 8 pm to 6 am on weekdays for some weeks.

Chris Packham is promoting a video on behalf of the Wildlife Trust highlighting the massive environmental damage being done by HS2 Ltd., far greater than has previously been acknowledged.

There seems no interest in these findings by the Government.

This publication is produced with members of the community with sight problems and others who have difficulties reading books and newspapers in mind. It is an entirely free-to-user service and produced by volunteers of the KTNA from its base at The Waverley Centre, Kenilworth.

The recordings are published fortnightly using local news and national magazine copy. The recordings run for approximately 90 minutes in two sections, news and a magazine which features articles on a variety of interests from local history, music, literary items, gardens & places to visit and more. Each item has its own track for ease of access and listening. Produced on a memory stick, delivered free of charge via Royal Mail to those who register with us, or by access on-line, it is hoped to help our listeners engage with current happenings in our communities and help them feel less isolated. A listening device, a kind of simple to operate "Boom Box", is supplied free of charge for those listeners registered for the memory stick who require it.

University of Warwick Update March 2023

I wanted to share a brilliant project my colleagues have developed. Using the format of the BAFTA and National Comedy Award-winning TV show 'Taskmaster', the University of Warwick has given young people across Coventry, Warwickshire, and beyond the opportunity to learn about interesting aspects of the law through fun and interactive tasks. With the success of last year's competition, 25 universities across the country have signed up to roll-out the programme nationally, including Oxford, Edinburgh and Leeds universities.

These universities will oversee the Taskmaster School Tasking programme delivered to over 6000 children at up to 125 schools, particularly in low-income areas.

Warwick Law School began the national rollout of School Tasking last year by working with primary school children in Year 5 from a diverse range of backgrounds, aiming to widen access to university for underrepresented pupils.



Children from Year 5 classes are split into teams of five or six, to compete against each other and other local schools in a bid to be crowned the year's School Tasking Champions.

The project was founded and led by Warwick Associate Professor, Dr Ali Struthers, who sought special permission from the creator and star of the show Taskmaster, Alex Horne who has become a great supporter of the scheme, describing the work of Ali and the University of Warwick as "remarkable".

During the in-school sessions, classes are introduced to some of the most interesting areas of the law and given a chance to practice key skills from communication to lateral thinking, just as in the TV show. What a wonderful way of getting young people interested in the law!
