Stoneleigh History Society

In preparation for celebrating the King's Coronation, members of the Society have been busy compiling a new display, which will be in the Leigh Chapel of the church by the time you are reading this. Lisa Reay, with expert help from Pam Baker, has scoured the newspaper archives for articles about what was happening in Stoneleigh at important points in the life of the King.

The key dates researched so far are 1948, the year King Charles was born; 1958, the year he was created Prince of Wales and Earl of Chester, and 1969 the year he was invested as Prince of Wales. It is surprising that after all this time the Village had the same concerns as now: speed of traffic through the Village, aircraft noise, the pollution of the river and events to raise money for the church roof.

We also remember in the display those who have gone before us and those who were married in the Church, one marriage involving their horse being amongst the guests!




May Reflections

Stoneleigh Community Orchard CIC update - Pete Freeman

At our meeting of the 16th March, Stoneleigh Community Orchard CIC welcomed two new directors, Adrian Clarke and Amanda Smith to the board. Both Adrian and Amanda bring with them a wealth of experience gained commercially and acquired whilst serving on other local groups. We wish them well in their new posts. Fellow directors Nora Blagburn and Quentin Compton-Bishop are leading the planning of a Blossom Event to be held in the Orchard on Whit Bank holiday Monday between 15:00 & 16:30, the details of which are contained in the News flyer (see page 22). It is the intention of the event to allow villagers, as well as the general public, to gain an insight into the Orchard project and the processes involved in cider making as well as to have some fun in the process. As cider pasteurization and boxing up commences at the end of April there will, of course, be cider available for purchase and sampling on the day. Regular readers may recall that the Orchard acts as a focus for local environmental issues and in the recent past (and specifically prior to the pandemic lockdown in March 2020) John Churchley and I undertook a clean-up of the river embankment adjacent to the Orchard. This year in early April, on what could loosely be considered to have been the first fine and sunny day of spring, I revisited the same embankment with the aim of repeating the clean-up exercise. What at first sight seemed a pleasant scene, with spring celandine flowers breaking through to greet the early spring warmth, on closer inspection revealed a very polluted backdrop. An array of plastic bottles was scattered amongst the undergrowth together with assorted drink cans and plastic bags. My guess is that the bottles and bags had floated down the river from nearby Coventry and been deposited there when the flood levels receded. The presence of cans was more difficult to explain though possibly they had been thrown there from cars passing over the bridge? Items found covered the passage of humanity from cradle to grave which I will leave to the readers imagination as well as an A-Z of items involved in drug use. One notable item was a music CD of "Hot Chocolate's greatest hits", in

my opinion one of the few better bands of the 1970's! If pollution that is visible to the eye is reflected broadly in what is microscopic and invisible, then one may speculate regarding the water quality of our river in general? We do after all live downstream of a sewage farm and it is proposed to place further load on this facility through the urbanization of the nearby greenbelt with little if no consideration for infrastructure improvement. One may speculate about the state of a society that allows rivers to fall into such a condition – Oscar Wilde once reflected that "Our Society is terribly over-populated. Really, someone should arrange a proper scheme of assisted emigration".... I would personally add that this should particularly apply to those members of our society who litter and pollute at will!

BASIC LIFE SUPPORT (Training)

If a problem suddenly stops the heart pumping blood around the body, it is usually because something has interrupted the heart's electrical impulses and they have become chaotic. It is not a heart attack, though a heart attack may cause it. It is immediately critical and every minute's delay in defibrillation, to restore the electrical impulses to normal, and CPR is critical to survival.

That is why we have two defibrillators in Stoneleigh: one in the old phone box and the other outside the Village Hall. They are the same make and model. We hope never to have to use them but, in case we do have to, we are updating and expanding the team of volunteers trained in CPR and using the defibrillators, and their training.

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University of Warwick – April 2023

In recent weeks, I was reading about the Interdisciplinary Biomedical Research Building, known to most as IBRB (not that the full name isn't catchy!) It's one of the newest buildings on the University campus, and I thought it would be of interest to some of our friends and neighbours in Stoneleigh and Ashow. You probably pass it sometimes – the tall one on Gibbet Hill – so I did some digging to see what more I could find out. When it opened in 2021, it helped bring to life the University's commitment to deliver world-leading research in neuroscience, microbiology and infection, cell biology, and disease models. It's set up to support and facilitate interdisciplinary biomedical research of the highest quality, and create a dynamic teaching and learning environment for life sciences students and those studying medicine at Warwick.

What happens in the building is remarkable: I met some scientists thinking about antimicrobial resistance in state-of-the-art laboratories. Also, what happens on the outside of the building is worth mentioning too: over 390 vertical PV solar panels offset approximately 4,600kg CO2 emissions.

Since we declared a climate emergency with ambitious targets to reduce our carbon emissions to net zero, there has been a lot of thought given to how we design, develop and use our campus. The IBRB is a good example. It was completed to an industry-leading standard with 50% of the development comprising offsite manufacturing parts. A key advantage of this is an 80% reduction in deliveries to the site, so there were fewer vehicles on the roads. If it's of interest, I can share some more stories from the research



teams in future newsletters. Do let me know if there are any updates you'd like me to share.

HS2 UPDATE

During the past month the repercussions of delays to the completion of HS2 have featured in the national and specialist press. This coverage has included endless re-hashing of arguments featured since the project was announced. Currently there is some doubt that the connecting ends of the project, ie into Euston from Old Oak Common and into Digbeth from Birmingham Interchange (by the NEC) will be constructed to the same timescale as the remainder of Phase One.

Various items have appeared in local media reminding readers of personal tragedies regarding compulsory purchase orders, damage to the environment etc.

Locally there are few signs of reduced activity, quite the reverse if the number of lorries using Stoneleigh crossroads is anything to go by! With that in mind the deteriorating state of the B4115 and the Stoneleigh crossroads is noticeable. This has been reported to both WCC and BBV (the contractor) and we await any remedial action, but please if you have concerns, do raise them with these bodies.

There will be further road closures so please do look out for notices when they are issued.
